

Developing Leaders


Cultivating strong Indigenous leaders involves unique experiences, such as attending the Men Arise retreat in Seymour, Indiana. Three local men had the opportunity to join nearly 500 others from various backgrounds, all seeking spiritual growth, renewal, and a deeper connection with God.

Our group was particularly inspired!

Josh left challenged by the powerful sermons that brought Scripture to life. He was deeply impacted by David Spivey's call for men to become soldiers of God, truly stepping into their roles as spiritual leaders.

David was deeply inspired by the worship and ministry of the Word. Frank Heidler's teaching on spiritual warfare resonated with him, reminding him of the vital role of consecration, fasting, and prayer. He also felt God's gentle prompting to reassess how much time he spends on his phone.

Martin Lakota Chapel, serving on the outskirts of the Pine Ridge reservation, has been praying for a multi-purpose building for over 15 years. Thanks to the generosity of many donors, the building is nearly enclosed and the concrete floor with in-floor heat is poured. The crew spent many hours this summer getting it to this point, and as funds continue to come in, we are hoping it can be used this winter and have it completed by next summer.
